ope, it is not what you think! It is not that colleague down the passage who suffers from a mild case of verbal diarrhoea!


After doing some research for this article, I realised that I recently used this "tool" when I wanted to purchase something over the internet.

Me: What is a Chabot?

The techie: A Chabot is a computer program that, using rules and artificial intelligence, is used to assist with, among other things, information gathering or customer service.

Me: Can you give us a few examples of popular Chatbots?

The techie: Here are some:

- Instalocate personal travel assistant
- Meekan scheduling assistant
- Foxsy social bot for making new friends
- chatShopper Personal fashion shopping assistant

Me: Do you think Chatbots have a place in the working environment?

The techie: Daily repetitive tasks, looking up someone's contact details, requesting metrics like the daily sales figures from your sales manager. Any information that can be deduced from existing data somewhere can be answered by a chatbot. This way we can allow people to focus on things humans do best.

Me: Do you think chatbots will replace human assistants?

The techie: It's possible one day. If you do not go to the next level and make sure you are creative in what you do and only do work based on knowledge acquired over years you can be replaced by a Chabot or machine.
