- Have a back-up plan.

- Take the memory stick with the document and go to each EXCO member and save it on their computer
- Encourage your boss to work on the server and then phone each person and tell them how to access the doc on the server.
- Print out a few copies and hand them out.

The wonders of technology have the power to be life-savers but equally can get you into a pickle!
